NAILSWORTH TENNIS CLUB LTD CODE OF CONDUCT

The Player:

- Will respect the Equality and Diversity and Safeguarding policies of the Club
- Sports clothing should be worn by all playing members when on court.
- Tennis, non-marking shoes/trainers shall be worn at all times on court
- When other members are waiting to play a short set should be played
- No arranged fours at Club sessions
- Players are expected to behave in a sportsmanlike and mannerly way. They will not use inappropriate language, and racquet/ ball abuse will not be tolerated.
- Tennis balls are the property of the club and must remain at the club for all members to use. Match balls to be placed in the Club Room after matches
- The last members to leave the courts are responsible for ensuring all lights are off and the Clubroom and gates are locked. The Clubroom should be left neat and tidy.
- All players attending the Club must comply with the Covid restrictions current at that time.

The Junior Player:

- All juniors are expected to comply with the standards of behaviour outlined above
- Juniors wishing to play on a regular basis at senior club sessions may do so at the discretion of the committee and by payment of a senior or young adult subscription. The same applies to senior matches and club tournaments.

The Parent/Guardian of a junior should:

- Support your son / daughter and aid the developmental process both on and off the court.
- Allow the coach to run the coaching programme free from external pressures or influences.
- Behave in a manner that sets a positive example
- Notify the Coach of any changes to circumstances. This includes: medical (including injuries), photo consent and personal circumstances etc.
- Parent / Guardian to ensure that all appropriate fees are paid when due.

The Coach will:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of each person and treat them equally within the context of the sport.
- Place the wellbeing and safety of each player above all other considerations, including the development
 of the performance.
- Develop an appropriate working relationship with each player based on mutual trust and respect
 ensuring that the activities they direct are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of
 players.

- Encourage and guide players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance and promote good manners and sportsmanship. The coach will not tolerate inappropriate language or racquet/ball abuse.
- Consistently display high standards of behaviour and appearance.
- Maintain his/her LTA Coach accreditation.
